

provide in the manner prescribed for changes in the determination of allowances payable to veterans married to each other; to provide for an additional amount to be paid as a special award to a surviving spouse in respect of dependent children of veterans and in the case of blindness; to provide an allowance for certain widows with dependent children; to provide an allowance for a widow who was maintaining a veteran; to increase from 21 to 25 years the age until which a child may receive an allowance while following an approved course of instruction; to provide in the manner prescribed for the annual adjustment of the income factor and monthly rate for orphans, and for the quarterly adjustment of the income factor and monthly rate in the case of other recipients; to provide in the manner prescribed for a new allowance for dependent children and orphans and for a table of allowances setting out monthly rates and income factors to be used as a basis for future allowance adjustments; and to provide for certain transitional matters; (b) to amend the Civilian War Pensions and Allowances Act to provide equality of status for males and females in the manner prescribed; to provide under the circumstances prescribed for a new benefit for the former widow of a civilian who has remarried; to create a new entitlement to an allowance for civilians' widowers who have attained the age of sixty years; to provide for allowances under Part XI of the Act to be based on amounts set out in the schedule to the War Veterans Allowance Act; to provide entitlement to an allowance to a widow maintaining a civilian; and to provide for certain transitional matters.

Mr. Pelletier (Hochelaga), seconded by Mr. Sharp, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-5, An Act to establish the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission, to amend the Broadcasting Act and other Acts in consequence thereof and to enact other consequential provisions, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to establish the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission consisting of not more than nine full-time members and not more than ten part-time members and to provide for the salary and expenses of the full-time members and for the fees and expenses of the part-time members; to provide for the staff and, for the application of the Public Service Superannuation Act and any regulations made pursuant to section 7 of the Aeronautics Act to the full-time members of the Commission; and to provide for consequential amendments to the Broadcasting Act and other Acts and, for transitional provisions.

Mr. Andras, seconded by Mr. Sharp, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-6, An Act to establish a Canada Manpower and Immigration Council, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Administrator pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Administrator recommends to the House of Commons a measure to establish a Canada Manpower and Immigration Council composed of nineteen members, to provide for the expenses and remuneration of the Chairman, and in the case of a member other than the Chairman, for his expenses and allowances and for remuneration for any duties he performs with the approval of the Governor in Council on behalf of the Council in addition to his ordinary duties as a member thereof; to provide for the establishment of regional and local committees and for the remuneration and allowances of its members; and to provide for the staff of the Council or any committee otherwise than from the public service of Canada.
