CRITICISMS BY MINISTERS—REQUEST FOR EX-
PRESSION OF CONFIDENCE BY GOVERN-

Hon. Robert L. Stanfield (Leader of the Opposition): Mr. Speaker, I would like to ask the Prime Minister whether, in light of criticisms of the Auditor General made outside the House by members of his government, he could indicate that his government has confidence in the Auditor General and, if his answer is yes, will he request the members of his government to stop expressing non-confidence in the Auditor General?

Right Hon. P. E. Trudeau (Prime Minister): Yes, Mr. Speaker, the government has confidence in the Auditor General. Within his terms of reference he is a watchdog—
