

v. t. ina. 1. Watch it, iskska'-tsit; I watch it, nit̄sks'ka tsip; he watches it, ūsks'katsimai e.

v. t. an. 1. Watch me, iskskum'mokit; wate! him, iskskum'mis; I watch you, kit̄sks'kummo; he watches him, ūsks'kummi uaie.

Watching, *n. abstr.*, iskska'tük sín-ni.

Water, *n. ina.*, okh'ke'.

Water, *v. t. ina.* 3 (plants, etc.). Water it, atsiks'stoat; I water it, nitauts'iksistop; he waters it, auts'iksistemai e.

v. t. an. 1 (horses, etc.). Water him, sümme'pis; I water him, nit̄sümme'pian; he waters him, sümme'piuaie.

Watering, *n. abstr.* (plants, etc.), atsiks'stük sín ni; (horses, etc.), sümme'pitük sín ni.

Way, *n. ina.* (road), moksoku'i; (manner), his way, otsitappi'u-össin ni.

Wave, *n. ina.*, ökh'paikimskau.

We, *pers. pron.* (first and second persons), këstün'un; (first and third persons), nës tün'an.

Weak, *v. int.* 1. He is weak, ai'sotsiki u.

Wear, *v. t. ina.* 3 (clothes). Wear it, süpskaw'sattoat; I wear it, nitai'süpskaw sattop; he wears it, ai'süpskaw sattomai e.

v. t. an 2 (trousers or leggings).

Wear them, oau'attsisau; I wear them, nitai'auataiau; he wears them, au'auat tsiuax.

v. int. 1 (hat). Wear a hat, itsüm'mokit; I wear a hat, nit̄s'itsüm'moki; he wears a hat, ūs'itsüm'mokiu.

v. int. 1 (ear-rings). Wear thou ear-rings, otokh'ipiit; I wear ear-rings, nit'otokh'ipi; he wears ear-rings, itokh'ipiui.

v. int. 1 (bracelets). Wear thou bracelets, opun'it; I wear bracelets, nit'opuni; he wears bracelets, ipun'iu.

v. int. 1 (gloves). Wear gloves,

otse'tseit; I wear gloves, nitse'-tsetsi; he wears gloves, etse'tsiu.

v. int. 1 (necklace). Wear a necklace, okki'n'it; I wear a necklace, nit'okki'n'i; he wears a necklace, iki'n'i.

Wearing, *n. abstr.* (clothes), süpskaw'sín ni; (leggings), oai'sín ni; (hat), itsüm'mok sín ni; (earrings), tokh'ipi sín ni; (bracelets), pun'sín ni; (gloves), atse'tse-i-sín ni; (necklaces), okki'n'sín ni.

Weasel, *n. an.* (in winter), ap'au; (in summer), otau'.

Wedding, *n. abstr.* (in reference to a man), okem'siun ni; (in reference to a woman), om'siun ni.

Weed, *n. ina.*, ksüs'tapsüs'ki.

Week, *n.*, nato'yiksitsikui; (literally Holy Day, by which the weeks are counted. This, of course, is of recent date. The Indians of old knew no "Holy Day" or division of time into weeks).

Weigh, *v. reflect.* Weigh one's self, issokak'iosit; I weigh myself, nit̄s'kokakiosi; he weighs himself, ūs'kokakiosiu.

v. t. ina. 2. Weigh it, issokak'iiit; I weigh it, nit̄ssokokaiiip; he weighs it, ūs'kokakiimai e.

v. t. an. 1. Weigh me, issokak'iokit; weigh him, issokak'is; I weigh you, kit̄ssokokio; he weighs him, ūs'kokakiuaie.

Weighing, *n. abstr.*, issokak'iak-sin ni.

Weighing-scales, *n. an.*, it̄ssokok'iakiopi.

Weights, *n. an.*, it̄ssokok'iama-pian.

Well, *n. an.*, miksi'skum. See "Water horses."

Wet, *v. t. an.* 1. Wet me, atsiks's-tsüm'mokit; wet him, atsiks's-tsüm'mis; I wet you, kitauts'i-ksüs'tsüm'mo; he wets him, auts'iksüs'tsüm'miuai e.

v. t. an. 1. Wet me, atso'kit; wet him, atsi's'; I wet you, kitauts'o; he wets him, auts'iuaie.
