

v. t. ina. 1. Watch it, iskska'tsit; I watch it, nit üsk's'katsip; he watches it, üsk's'katsimaie.

v. t. an. 1. Watch me, isks-küm'mokit; wate! him, isks-küm'mis; I watch you, kit üsk's'-küm'mo; he watches him, üsk's'-küm'miuaie.

Watching, *n. abstr.*, iskska'tüksin-ni.

Water, *n. ina.*, okhko'.

Water, *v. t. ina. 3* (plants, etc.). Water it, atsiks's'toat; I water it, nitauts'iksistop; he waters it, auts'iksistomaie.

v. t. an. 1 (horses, etc.). Water him, sümme'pis; I water him, nitsümme'piau; he waters him, sümme'piuaie.

Watering, *n. abstr.* (plants, etc.), atsiks's'tüksin ni; (horses, etc.), sümme'pitüksin ni.

Way, *n. ina.* (road), moksoku'i; (manner), his way, otsitäppi'u-össin ni.

Wave, *n. ina.*, ökh'paikimskau.

We, *pers. pron.* (first and second persons), kësün'un; (first and third persons), nës tün'an.

Weak, *v. int. 1.* He is weak, ai'sötsikiu.

Wear, *v. t. ina. 3* (clothes). Wear it, süpskaw'sattoat; I wear it, nitai'süpskawsattop; he wears it, ai'süpskawsattomaie.

v. t. an. 2 (trousers or leggings). Wear them, oan'attsisau; I wear them, nitau'auattaiian; he wears them, au'auattsiuax.

v. int. 1 (hat). Wear a hat, istsum'mokit; I wear a hat, nit-üs'tsummoki; he wears a hat, üs'tsummoki.

v. int. 1 (ear-rings). Wear thou ear-rings, otokh'ipiit; I wear ear-rings, nit'otokhipii; he wears ear-rings, itokh'ipiiu.

v. int. 1 (bracelets). Wear thou bracelets, opun'it; I wear bracelets, nit'opuni; he wears bracelets, ipun'iu.

v. int. 1 (gloves). Wear gloves,

otse'tseit; I wear gloves, nitse'tsetsi; he wears gloves, etse'tsi i u.

v. int. 1 (necklace). Wear a necklace, okkin'it; I wear a necklace, nit'okkin i; he wears a necklace, ikin'iu.

Wearing, *n. abstr.* (clothes), süpskaw'sin ni; (leggings), oai'sin ni; (hat), istsum'moksin ni; (ear-rings), tokh'ipisin ni; (bracelets), pun'sin ni; (gloves), atse'tsei-sin ni; (necklaces), okkin'sin ni.

Weasel, *n. an.* (in winter), ap'au; (in summer), otai'.

Wedding, *n. abstr.* (in reference to a man), okem'sin ni; (in reference to a woman), om'sin ni.

Weed, *n. ina.*, ks's'tapsükii.

Week, *n.*, nato'yiksistiki; (literally Holy Day, by which the weeks are counted. This, of course, is of recent date. The Indians of old knew no "Holy Day" or division of time into weeks).

Weigh, *v. reflect.* Weigh one's self, issokak'iosit; I weigh myself, nitüs'sokakios i; he weighs himself, üs'sokakios i u.

v. t. ina. 2. Weigh it, issokak'it; I weigh it, nitüssokak'ip; he weighs it, üs'sokak'imaie.

v. t. an. 1. Weigh me, issokak'io kit; weigh him, issokak'is; I weigh you, kitüssokak'io; he weighs him, üssokak'iu aie.

Weighing, *n. abstr.*, issokak'iaksin ni.

Weighing-scales, *n. an.*, itüssokak'iakiopi.

Weights, *n. an.*, itüssokak'imaupiau.

Well, *n. an.*, miks's'kum. See "Water horses."

Wet, *v. t. an. 1.* Wet me, atsiks's'tsimmokit; wet him, atsiks's'tsimmis; I wet you, kitauts'iksistsimmo; he wets him, auts'iks's'tsimmiuaie.

v. t. an. 1. Wet me, atso'kit; wet him, ats's'; I wet you, kitauts'o; he wets him, auts'iu aie.
