

HEARTS OF OAK AT BLUE BONNETS CAPTURES THE CONNAUGHT CUP

Comes From Behind and Defeats Privet Petal in Desperate Struggle — Bryndam Repeats in Steeplechase.

MONTREAL, June 2.—One of the most spirited duels ever witnessed at the Blue Bonnets track took place this afternoon in the race for the Connaught Cup, the feature event on the program. By the commanding of Calgary, the race was practically left to Hearts of Oak and Privet Petal, and these two put up a desperate struggle. After some smooth running for half the distance, Privet Petal got into the lead by a burst of speed, and rounding into the stretch was three lengths to the good. Gray, on Hearts of Oak, then let out a link, which sent his horse to the neck of the Hendrie colt, and another effort took the Giddings horse past the post a winner by a scant inch.

There were only three starters in the steeplechase, which was won by the long shot, Bryndam, the favorite, fell. Results:
