F. J. DINGWALL RETURNS.

F. J. Dingwall, of the D. R. Dingwall, Limited, has just returned from a three months' trip to England and the continent where he has been on a successful purchasing tour at the leading jewellery centres. He visited

reading jewelry centres. He visited en route, Chicago, Toronto, New York, London, Liverpool, and from there he went to Amsterdam, where the "Ding-wall" diamonds are selected and cut. He arrived just before the advance in rough stones, which has amounted to 15 per cent. in two months.

Mr. Dingwall spent a few days at The Hague and Cologne, and from there he went to the small towns in the Black forests of Germany, famous for their domestic workshops. Berlin he found to be a brisk city where the automobile is used very extensively for conveying travellers around to many interesting places, such as the art galleries, Kaiser's palace and the Bismarck monument.

Dresden, noted for its fine chinawares, was also visited and many selections

were made there. Mr. Dingwall then journeyed to Vienna, where the summer palace of the emperor of Austria is situated. From there he went to Venice, a city of boats, but a city in which Mr. Dingwall was much disappointed, he having expected to find a nice, clean city, but found it the reverse.

A short time he spent in Rome, in connection of the glories of the apostolic capital, but the Catacombs, St. Peter's Vatican, palace of Caesar and the Colosseum were not his chief interest. His wall speaks particularly of the news and robes of the pope, which were indeed interesting. Going farther and south, he visited the city of Naples, and then Monte Carlo, which he describes as a garden of Eden in its appearance. Thence he sailed for Paris, the beauty of London then to Birmingham and Sheffield where were secured some fine jewelry, sterling silver and a watch. The trip being one of business interest, very little time was spent sight-seeing, but each place mentioned is well described in the articles published for the western trade.
