- 32.—An Alderman to be elected by the Council and to have certain powers during absence or sickness of Mayor, &c.
- 33.—Election of Auditors.
- 34.—Oaths to be taken by Mayor, Aldermen, &c.
- 35.—Fines for non-acceptance of office of Mayor, Alderman, Councillor, Assessor, or Auditor.
- 36.—Cases in which Mayor, Aldermen &c. shall become disqualified.
- 37.—Mayor, &c. to be Justices of the Peace, and the Mayor to receive a salary.
- 38.—Council to name officers, &c. Mayor may name Assistant Clerk to act during the absence or sickness of the City Clerk.
- 39.—Powers of Assessors, Surveyors, &c.
- 40.—Non-payment of assessment to be liable to ten per cent increase per annum.

- 53.—Council may make Bye-Laws to prevent accidents by fire.
- 54.—Firemen exempted from certain duties, &c.
