

*Article 112.*—No Vessel or Steamer shall be anchored or moored at any of the wharves of Sorel for winter quarters nearer another Vessel or Steamer longitudinally than 30 feet therefrom, and the Master, Pilot, or person in charge, the owner or agent of such vessel, shall remove the same, if anchored or moored at a less distance than 30 feet longitudinally, within one hour after being required so to do by the officer or person authorised to act in that behalf by the said Harbour Commissioners, under the penalty hereinafter provided for a breach of these By laws, and under a further like penalty for every twenty four hours during which such steamer or vessel shall not be removed in conformity herewith.

*Article 113.*—No Schooners, Barges, Bateaux or other small River Craft shall be placed, anchored or moored for winter quarters in the Harbour of Sorel, between the space comprised without the entrance to the said Harbour and the point opposite the building known as the Steam Mill. And if so placed, anchored or moored, the Master, Pilot, or person in charge, the owner or agent of such Vessel, shall remove the same within one hour after being required so to do by the officer or person authorised to act in that behalf by the said Harbour Commissioners, under the penalty hereinafter provided for a breach of these By-laws, and under a further like penalty for every twenty four hours during which such Steamer or Vessel shall not be removed in conformity herewith.

*Article 114.*—No Vessel or Crib shall anchor or moor in the River Yamaska within six (6) arpents from the head of the Island called "*Isle de Rouches*" to the entrance of the passage called the Doré, nor within the said passage or Channel called the Doré, from its said entrance to the head of the Island called *Isle Beaucamp*, under the penalty hereinafter provided for a breach of these By-laws, and under a further like penalty for each subsequent twenty-four hours during
