Concocted Them Up. "The most difficult task," the governor-general continued, "was to drive the revolutionaries out of the Trans-Siberian Railroad between Moscow and Peking (three miles east of Moscow), and surround them in the Plesetsk district, so that they could not escape. These tasks were successfully accomplished."

"The strikers of the Prokhorovsk Mills, who held the proprietor as a hostage, were ready to surrender. Friday, but Colonel Iliin, the chief of the negotiations, declined to accept their surrender unless they also delivered up the 'princelings,' the soldiers of the revolutionists, who had sought refuge there."

Governor-General Doubassoff further declared emphatically that the artillery bore down on the houses from which the revolutionists fled.


