**TACKLING THE ESTIMATES**  
**RIVERDALE GETS A LOCK**

The Time Means Money, But Prop-  
erty Committee Passed It—  
Fire Dept. Increases.

The civic property committee did  
some toying with the property com-  
missioner's estimates yesterday, and  
\$42,983 was struck off and \$2307 added.  
Mr. Harris asked \$121,396, as against  
\$100,472 last year.

Ald. Church objected to \$6000 for an  
illuminated clock in Bolton-avenue  
fire station. Incidentally West wanted it  
in Cowan-avenue station instead, but  
Ald. Chisholm insisted that the east end  
had been promised the next tower clock.  
The item passed and \$2000 was voted  
for Cowan-avenue, on Controller Ward  
agreeing to have \$4000 for other im-  
provements left out, if necessary.

The smoke nuisance was debated on  
an item of \$780 for city smoke inspec-  
tors' salary. "What is he going?" asked  
Ald. McBride. Ald. McMurrich said  
the city hall chimney was the worst  
nuisance in the city. Mr. Harris said the man-  
ufacturers should not be forced into  
compliance at present. He was having  
a conference with them.

Controller Ward read a letter from  
a manufacturer, claiming that there  
was no known apparatus that would  
save fuel or lessen the volume of smoke.  
Ald. Adams, as a manufacturer, declared like scepticism,  
but Mr. Harris declared positively that  
there were half a dozen.

Over said Weight Coal.  
The estimates asked for \$1716 for  
two permanent coal inspectors and one  
ensured for six months. Last year the  
inspectors whose duties allow them to  
stop carts on the streets only, and not  
discuss the volume of smoke, examined 4888  
loads and hundred and ninety-two  
loads had been found accurate in  
weight. The total in short weight was  
\$2,787 pounds.

Ald. McMurrich complained that the  
present penalty of merely making up  
the short weight wasn't severe enough.  
The offending coal dealers should be  
exposed and prosecuted. Ald. Adams  
suggested that the loads be confiscated.  
The City.

In the meeting of the fire com-  
missioners' estimates, the fire com-  
missioner's estimates were reduced by  
\$1200 more than offered by the ad-  
dition of a clock to Cowan-avenue fire  
station, \$2000 and \$187 for small items;  
police stations, repairs, etc., were cut  
\$200; items aggregating \$1000 for re-  
pairs to tower clocks in four public  
buildings went by the board. For re-  
novating St. Paul's Hall, \$235 was  
taken off, and \$150 added for resur-  
facing the roof.

Ald. Chisholm objected to \$300 for buy-  
ing two portraits of former mayors, but  
it passed. Besides the \$20,000 assembly  
hall item for revolving doors, and  
\$2500 for a fire pump was voted down.  
As it now stands \$90,720 is asked in  
all.

**Increased Pay at Jail.**

The movement to fix \$2 a day as the  
minimum wage for civic workers had  
its effect in a petition from the turn-  
keys and guards at the jail to be paid  
on that basis. There are 12 men so  
employed, they being Ontario govern-  
ment appointees whose wages are gov-  
erned by the city. The committee recom-  
mended an increase from \$1.75 per  
day to \$2.75 per day, from the present  
\$1.25 to \$2.25 increase.

**Fire Chief's Complaint.**

Chief Thompson had smooth sailing  
with his estimates of the cost of run-  
ning the fire department for the year.  
Not only was every item approved in  
the figures submitted, but the chief's  
added request for salary in-  
creases amounting to \$1225 per an-  
num, and it is likely that the city will  
be asked to pass legislation to in-  
crease the salaries of the three chief  
fire chiefs from \$1000 to \$1500 per  
annum; secretary, \$1000 to \$1500;  
the assistant chief from \$1000 to  
\$1200 per annum; superintendent, \$1000  
to \$1200 per annum; relief engine-  
ers, \$875 to \$900; telephone  
operator, \$775 to \$850; steam-  
fitter, \$775 to \$850.

**Fire Chief's Complaint.**

Ald. Noble paid a complement to the  
department's system of closely check-  
ing expenditures. If followed in the city  
councils would save the city  
thousands of dollars.

The chief termed the district chiefs  
reliable, worthy and efficient men, but  
he only failed to give them the special  
attention to the lack of alarm boxes in the  
important business district south of King  
street between Yonge and York. There  
was only one box, between Yonge and  
Water, and he suggested one on Front-  
street, near Bay, which was approved.

**The Street Lighting Estimates of \$123,194.**

As a tender, were passed, \$90,921  
being for street lighting, \$29,653  
for street gas lamps, and \$2882 for gas  
lamps and electric lights.

The city engineer's estimates for the  
year, amounting to nearly a million  
dollars, were passed by the council  
yesterday. The estimates for bridge main-  
tenance was cut from \$14,750 to \$11,000.  
In order to protect the waterfront,  
\$1000 was added for a gas launch.  
For three underground lavatories, \$4150  
was also tucked on.

**The Other Reductions were:**

meter, machine and blacksmith shop,  
\$1031 from James-street widening, \$2000  
from high level pumping station, \$500  
from slip dredging, and \$350 from con-  
duit inspection.

**Will Be Discussed.**

The executive of the board of trade  
yesterday afternoon took up the ques-  
tion of the proposed "salary grab" by  
the city council. It was stated that  
it will be one of the items to be  
come before the board of trade council.

**NEW FISHERY LAWS.**

There will be a thorough overhauling  
of the fishery regulations during the con-

**Separate Schools to Share.**

Hon. Dr. Fyfe yesterday received a  
deputation representing separate schools  
desiring that the people of their faith  
should share in any general improve-  
ment of the school system. The min-  
ister stated that the request was very  
reasonable. Hon. J. J. Foy head-  
ed the deputation, which was composed  
of Vice-General McCann, Rev. Fr.  
Hand, and D. A. Carey.

**A Railway Viaduct.**

The executive of the board of trade  
has informed the mayor that they  
favor a viaduct on the Esplanade east  
of Bathurst-street, from the river to  
the freight trains to be run over it, with  
shunting to be done below at night.

NO REDISTRIBUTION LAW

SAYS PREMIER WHITNEY

Neither is There to Be a Salary Grab

at Coming Session of

Legislature.

The apparent certainty on the part  
of Liberal workers that there will be  
a redistribution of Toronto constitu-  
encies thus making a place in Centre  
Toronto for the local legislature, is  
founded purely upon hot air. Premier  
Whitney stated very plainly last night  
that there will be no redistribution of  
legislative districts at the coming ses-  
sion at all. He also declared that he  
thought of the government fees pretty  
well satisfied with the way things are.  
Mr. Whitney also denied the rumor  
that there is to be a move for the in-  
crease of the seasonal indemnity to  
members. The matter has not been  
discussed by the cabinet, and there are  
no signs of a salary grab looming up  
so far for the coming session.

The speech from the throne was rat-

hands of the printers.

opening of the session. The legislative  
chamber has been neatly tidied, and  
the opening will be a fine function.
