

Uniformed Knights a Hindrauce. Louisville, Aug. 17.—Too many officers have hurt the uniform rank of the Knights of Pythias, according to the report of Supreme Chancellor Tracy R. Bangs, which contained the following: "The military branch of the order has been the cause of much concern. We have for years taken it upon faith, and it strikes me that it is about time to stop long enough to take stock and en-deavor to ascertain whether the uni-form rank, as now managed and con-trolled, is a benefit or a hindrance to the order of Knights of Pythias. 


