SOLDIER-PRISONERS WILL HAVE CITIZENS APPEAL FOR THEM

Deputation Will See Minister of Justice in Effort To Let Vets Out For Peace Day.

Representation both by letter and by Mayor C. R. Somerville and a deputation personally will be made to the minister of justice at Ottawa for the release of the returned soldiers in the local jail who wish to celebrate on July 19 the peace for which they endured wounds and months of hardship.

J. Bridgen, a returned soldier, who said that he did not belong to the city council, addressed the city council on the matter on Monday evening. He suggested that the city solicitor be asked to act on the matter. However, as the council and a deputation are going to Ottawa on other business, it was thought that they could bring action quicker.

In addressing the council, Mr. Bridgen declared that the men were all serving for minor offences. As a result, he said, the city was almost brought to disgrace by the Toronto papers. The returned soldiers did not want to be Bolsheviks, but they thought that something should be done for these men who had fought and won victories.

KNIGHTS OF PYTHIAS
SESSIONS OF GRAND
ONTARIO LODGE OPEN
ST. THOMAS, July 7.—Early tomorrow morning Mayor Horton and other members of the city council will make the official presentation of the city's key to a monster gathering of Knights of Pythias, who are already arriving here tonight in large numbers to attend the sessions of the Grand Lodge of Ontario, which open here tomorrow. The affair is being conducted by Rathbone Lodge, No. 12, and a royal entertainment has been provided for the visiting grand lodge officers, who are expected from all parts of Canada and the United States.

Tomorrow morning the convention will open as soon as the civic ceremonies have been completed, and in the afternoon the visiting Pythians, with their local brothers, will make merry at Port Stanley, where a banquet is already in course of preparation for them. In the evening a special performance will be given at the Star Theatre.

On Wednesday at 12:30 a banquet will be tendered to Charles Davies, supreme chancellor, and Harry Wade, president of the insurance department, at the local Y. M. C. A. by the board of trade. Both are well known in the financial world, and the board of trade is anxious to have a good attendance of members.

Many of the visiting delegates are motoring here. The grand lodge officers arrived here this afternoon from Ottawa. Others from the Middle and Western provinces, including Colorado and Denver, are expected here tonight.

The convention is to be one of the biggest grand lodge in this city, and great preparations have been made for the event.

TRUOPS DISPERSED
AT EASTERN POINT
ARRIVE IN LONDON
A party of 29 soldiers who crossed the Atlantic on the S. S. Mauretania and were dispersed at an eastern point, arrived in London last night at 9:03 o'clock, via the Grand Trunk. The party included seven Londoners and three soldiers with no address. Of the remaining members, two were St. Thomas men, seven were for Windsor, three for Caledonia, and seven were en route to Chicago.

The out-of-town soldiers of the party left for their respective homes last night, and as they were discharged before reaching London, the military authorities of this district did not deal with their demobilization on arrival here.
