MADE GOOD TIME IN A SPEED TEST

Wilbur Wright's New Flying Machine Travels 54 1-2 Miles Per Hour in a Speed Test. Washington, D. C., July 21—In two short flights in the Wright aeroplane this evening at Fort Myer (Va.), Orville Wright, closely approached the world's speed record, attaining an average velocity of fifty-four 1/2 miles an hour as computed by Wilbur Wright, who held the stopwatch on the machine after he had a dozen rounds of the course. The Wright brothers had decided to give this speed test only a ten-minute trial today, and the aviator brought the aeroplane to the earth after ten minutes and fifty seconds in the air.
