SPANISH TROOPS REPULSED MOORS

Artillery and Gunboats Take Part a Sanguinary Engagement-Losses are Heavy.

Madrid, July 21.—According to the latest despatches, the Moors made a series of fierce attacks at several points along the Spanish line with the evident object of cutting communication between Melilla and General Marina's camp at Atalayou and to isolate the stores in the station at the extremity of the Spanish position. The Moors advanced steadily along the railroad, but were driven back by the artillery. The Spanish troops were aided by a tribe of faithful Kabyles. The Moorish losses were considerable.

Extra provisions and arms are being rushed to the exposed Spanish posts. The gunboat Martin Alonzo Pinzon bombarded the enemy, but was forced to fire high in order to avoid the Spanish forces. The Moors employed modern and daring tactics. They cut the telephone wires and often endangered the Spanish positions. The Spanish loss was ten killed and twenty wounded.
