sities, Five Dollars; for Matriculation from other Faculties in this University, Three Dollars; for Graduates in Arts of this University, Two Dollars. No Fee is exacted from Graduates in Arts of this University who have taken Honors in the Department of Natural Sciences.

Candidates are required to have matriculated before presenting themselves for any Professional Examination.

Candidates on giving notice of intention to present themselves at the Matriculation Examination are required to signify whether they purpose taking the Pass or Honor Examination. Scholarships are only awarded in connection with the latter.

The following groups of subjects must be passed by every Matriculant :---

(1) Three out of the four languages, Latin, Greek, French, and German, one of which must be Latin.
