

ART. 9.—This Board has no power to pay any money to missionaries unless they first have satisfactory evidence that said missionaries have faithfully done their work. In no case have they power to deduct from the appropriation to the mission field, if the work has been done satisfactorily. The Board has power to add to the appropriation in necessitous cases. All assessments and appropriations must be made by this Board.

ART. 10.—The decisions of the Board shall be final on all questions of finance pertaining to our home missions when not conflicting with the parent society.

ART. 11.—At any meeting of the Board seven members shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

ART. 12.—The Board shall make provision for the annual missionary meeting, to be held at the time and place of the meeting of the Annual Conference, providing the Board deems it advisable to hold said meeting.

ART. 13.—The Board has no authority to order any money paid to missionaries until they first receive a written report from such field. This report shall contain the number of members, number of appointments, amount of missionary money raised on said field, minister's salary, probability of said charge becoming self-sustaining, and all other information that will assist the Board in the righteous distribution of its funds, the report to be written by the missionary upon the field. If impossible for him to attend to the writing of it himself from sickness, such report shall be given by the P. E. These reports must be in the hands of the Secretary within twenty-four hours of the opening of the Annual Conference.
