CONSTANTINOPLE
"HELL ON EARTH"

Turkish Newspaper Man, a Refugee, Talks to Boston Reporter

(Boston Globe) Selim Djavad Bey, formerly the proprietor of the oldest daily newspaper in Constantinople, who is staying with friends in Cambridge, is the first refugee to arrive from Constantinople, having left that city on March 2. All law and order has been forgotten there, he says, and the city is a "hell on earth."

He says that the Turkish people are becoming very hostile to the Germans. The condition of affairs in the capital of the Ottoman Empire is frightful. "The Anglo-French fleet, the Bey insisted, "will eventually force the Dardanelles; no Turk in Constantinople disputes that. Even the ranking army and navy officials will admit that we are gravely but, of course, privately, it is also true that the allies will have to pay dearly for such a victory. But even such a costly victory is worth winning, because it is a foregone conclusion that the Turkish power of endurance will be shattered with the entrance of the allied fleet to the Sea of Marmora."

The most heroic exploits of the French soldiers have been achieved, for the character of the fighting has allowed more scope for individual gallantry in the personal craft of war than in the siege work of entrenched positions. It is to the Alpine Chasseurs, the "blue devils" of France, as they are called, because of their blue bonnets and hunters' dress, that the success of the final attack last week is due.

Paris, March 31.—Owing to the great interest of the military situation on the extreme left, it is likely that the importance of the victory obtained during the last few days in Haute Alsace will be overlooked in England.

"BLUE DEVILS" OF FRANCE RUSHED Foe From Heights

Capture of Hartmanns-Weilerkopf by Alpine Chasseurs Extremely Valuable—Won After Many Months

Ottawa, March 30.—George A. Slater, head of the George A. Slater firm of Montreal, sold the Canadian militia 5,000 pairs of Invictus boots. No specification or sample, he said, accompanied the order. He had a hard time landing it, however, and he told the boots committee something of his tribulations today.

"Do you consider 50 cents per pair a fair charge for commission to an agent selling boots to the government?" asked Mr. McCurdy.

At the afternoon session W. V. Matthews, manufacturing manager of the Ames-Holden-McCreedy Co. Ltd., was on the stand. He admitted that 1,200 of the 1,800 pairs of boots they supplied had a double leather vamp, composed of two pieces of leather joined with rubber cement, pressed and crimped. He said that this added to the durability and water resisting qualities of the boots and that, although he had seen no specifications, he thought this made the boots better than were expected.
