**ENGLAND QUICKLY
NEARING NORMAL**

Lord Atholstán Failed to
Find a Single Pessimist
While Visiting London.

Montreal, May 29.—"I failed to find
a pessimist in England," was one of
the statements made by Baron Atholstán
on his return after a pleasure
visit of five months abroad, most of
which was spent in Egypt.
Accompanied by Lady Atholstán
and his daughter, the Hon. Alice
Graham, His Lordship crossed from
England on the Canadian Pacific liner
Empress of Britain.
When asked a question regarding
conditions in England, His Lordship
answered as quoted in "The Evening
Times," and he added: "When I asked my
own pessimists they told me that
I would have to go to the time to find
them."

"Certainly everybody I met was
cheerful and happy and every indi-
vidual displayed the utmost optimism.
It was quite clear that England is
close to normal, not at least, according
to state very rapidly. London was
fully crowded and there appeared to
be plenty of money to spend. The
hotels were crowded, the trains were
crowded, even to the extent of carry-
ing passengers in the corridors."
Spent Time in Egypt.
Lord Atholstán said that he had no
knowledge of conditions on the Con-
tinent and was not in a position to dis-
miss any of the recent developments.
A considerable portion of his time
abroad had been spent in Egypt. "That
was a most pleasant experience," said
he. "There was a considerable influx
of tourists and travelers to Egypt and
everybody appeared to be enjoying
themselves thoroughly."

His Lordship was asked if he had
received any encouragement as a re-
sult of the generous offer made by him
for cancer research. "I have received
very encouraging reports," he an-
swered, "and I was told that we are
on the eve of important discoveries.
Just what these are I am not in a
position to say. You know scientific
men are not very communicative and
that they do not speak until they are
really assured that real results have
been obtained, but conditions appear
most hopeful indeed."

"We had a very pleasant voyage, but
it is really good to be back in Mon-
treal," said His Lordship, as a parting
word.

**C. CURTIS GOES
FROM SYDNEY N. S. TO
POST AT FALL RIVER**
Sydney, N. S., May 29.—C. C. Cur-
tis, for the last five years general man-
ager of the Cape Breton Electric Com-
pany's light, power and railway ser-
vice, here has been transferred to Fall
River, Mass., to take charge of other
Stor and Webster interests there. He
was president of the Board of Trade,
a Episcopalian, and active in many civic
movements. He is at present in Bos-
ton.
