"UNDER COVER" IS WELL PRESENTED

New Local Talent Brought to Front in K. of C. Production in St. Vincent's Auditorium

Roi Cooper Meguire's four-act melodrama, "Under Cover," received an excellent rendition last evening by an amateur cast under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus, St. John Council. Although the great majority of the cast made their first appearance before the footlights last night, the piece was handled in a capable manner to the entire satisfaction of a large audience.

The play was under the direction of Arthur McCloskey and was staged in the new St. Vincent's auditorium in Cliff street. The stage settings were remarkably attractive and the scenery, which was painted particularly for the performance, was well executed.

Miss Margaret Power made a decided hit in her debut on the local stage. Her charming personality, a pleasing well modulated voice and the ease with which she portrayed the situations which the role of Miss Cartwright called for, won the favor of the audience from the very start. Opposite her, John Flood, as Stephen Denby, the erstwhile snuggler and secret service detective, executed a difficult part with great success. Last evening was also his first appearance on the amateur stage.

Arthur McCloskey added another success to his large number in the part of Daniel Taylor, a deputy in the customs, while David Higgins and Douglas Hill, as his assistants, caused much mirth and helped materially in many of the strong situations which abound in the piece. Edward J. Henneberry was evidently in Meguire's mind when he wrote the part of Monty Vaughan; he fitted like the proverbial glove and his interpretation of the role was all that could be asked.
