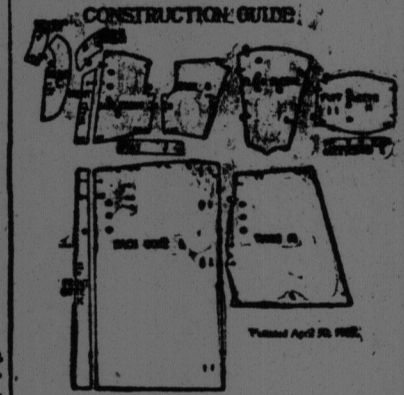
A BORDERED LAWN.



8 yards will be required if it is 44 inches wide. Two yards of ribbon and 2 yards of edging for the sleeves and collar will just about make up the balance if the ribbon is 15 cents a yard and the lace 10 cents. Either puffed or plain sleeves may be used.

First make the waist. Sew the front to side front (on right side) as notched, leaving left side edges free for opening. Close under-arm seam as notched; close shoulder seam. Sew round collar to neck edge and standing collar to stand as notched. Gather lower edge of waist between double "T" perforations. Sew stay to gathered edge, centers even, small "o" perforation at under-arm seam.

New take up dart in back gore of skirt, as perforated. Pleat, bringing "T" to corresponding small "o" perforations. Close back seams of back gore and tunic. Form double inverted pleat in back gore, crossing on slot perforations; bring folded edges to center-back; stitch from upper edge to small "o" perforation and press. Pleat front edge of tunic, bringing "T" to corresponding small "o" perforations. Gather upper edge between double "T" perforations. Turn hem on small "o" perforations. Arrange on back

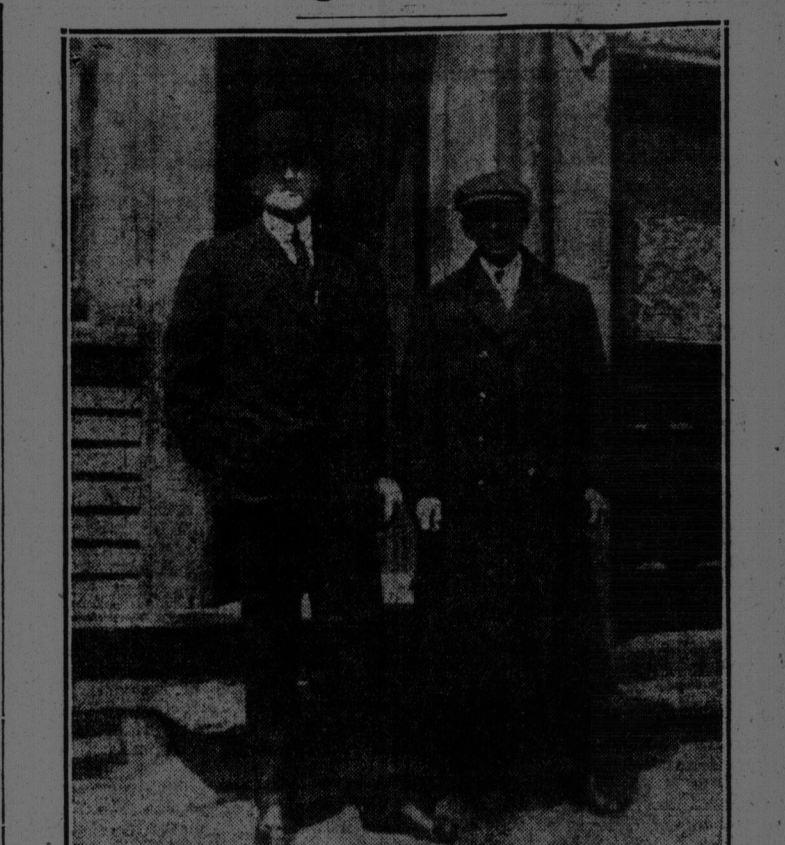

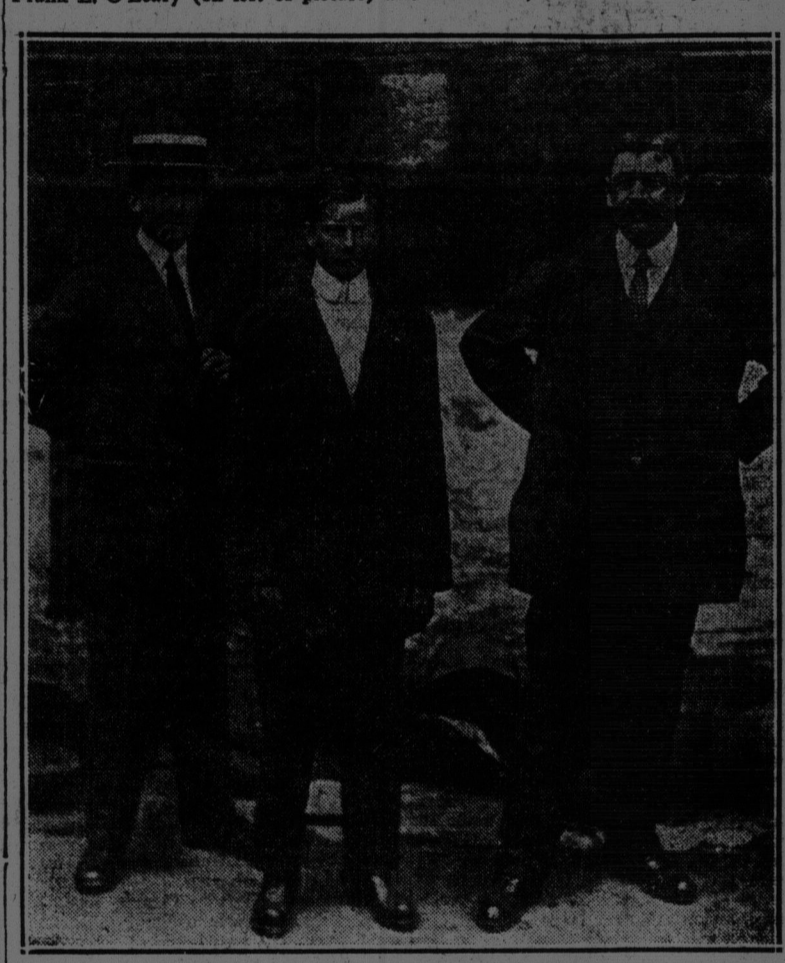

GIRL SAILS FOR BLEAK LABRADOR TO WED

Montreal, July 6.—The steamer Nascope left Montreal today with provisions for the traders of the Hudson's Bay Company on the bleak coast of Labrador, Baffin Land and Hudson Bay. This is the third year the Nascope has gone on such a trip, and Captain Meikel and his crew expect to return, to the St. Lawrence in the fall.

There are six passengers, one of whom Miss Anderson, the only lady on board, is going to Cartwright, Labrador, to be married. She sailed as stewardess. Besides provisions for the crew calculated to last a year, if necessary, the vessel carries 2,600 tons of provisions and trading goods for the Hudson's Bay Company.
