

USED NEWSPAPER  
CLIPPINGS AS BAITRadio Wireless Telephone Of-  
ficials Sent Out False State-  
ments With Dividend Checks

New York, Dec. 12.—Stockholders of the Radio Wireless Telephone Company received in 1909 dividend notices with newspaper clippings attached setting forth that the British government was under contract to equip all its naval vessels with the wireless telephone, according to evidence introduced by the federal authorities today in the trial of Lee DeForest, James D. Smith, Elmer J. Burlingame and Samuel W. Darby. These four officers of the Radio company and subsidiaries are charged with having made fraudulent use of the mail to promote the sale of stocks.

A reproduction of a clipping telling of the alleged contract was shown by government counsel. The dividend notice to which it was attached stated that "we are reproducing extracts from newspapers which will show the steady advance being made by the company."

Darby, first of the defendants to take the stand, said he approved the form and language of this notice. "It certainly was a matter of interest to the stock-

holders what the newspapers said," he testified.

"Was the British government on Aug. 18, 1909, under contract to fit out the ships of its navy with wireless telephones?"

"Not that I know of," Darby replied. "It was not a fact as far as I know."

A prospectus was read to Darby which said the officials of the company had invested their money. He said he had invested no money.

A radiogram to the navy department from Rear Admiral Badger, command-in-chief of the Atlantic fleet, describing the accident, said there was no cause for alarm.

**UNCLE SAM TO  
SETTLE DISPUTE  
OVER BRACELET**

Customs Seize \$6,000 Article Found  
By Maid on Train to Liverpool and

New York, Dec. 12.—A gold bracelet studded with diamonds and valued at \$6,000, found by a maid and claimed by

a nobleman, was held by custom officials here today till someone pays duty on it.

The bracelet was found on a train between Liverpool and London by a maid employed by F. Greenwood, of this city. Mr. Greenwood was entrusted with the bracelet, and shortly afterwards the Marquis de San Carlos de

Pedroco claimed it. His description of the article did not satisfy Mr. Greenwood, who refused to surrender it. When the Marquis arrived here today there was a dispute on the pier between Mr. Greenwood and the Marquis. This the inspectors ended, holding the bracelet for payment of duty after giving Mr. Greenwood a receipt.

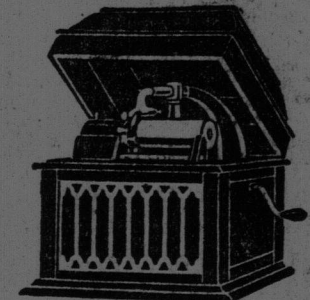

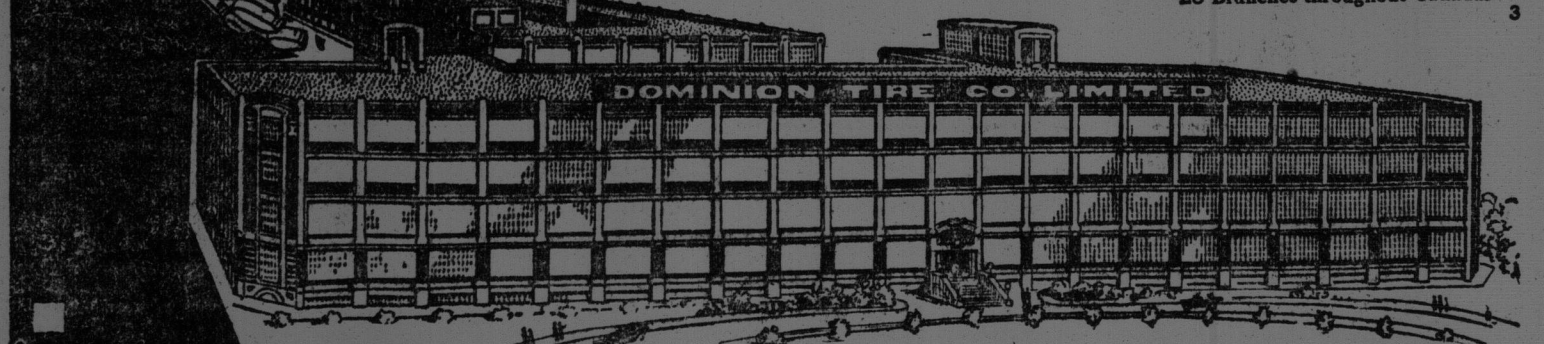

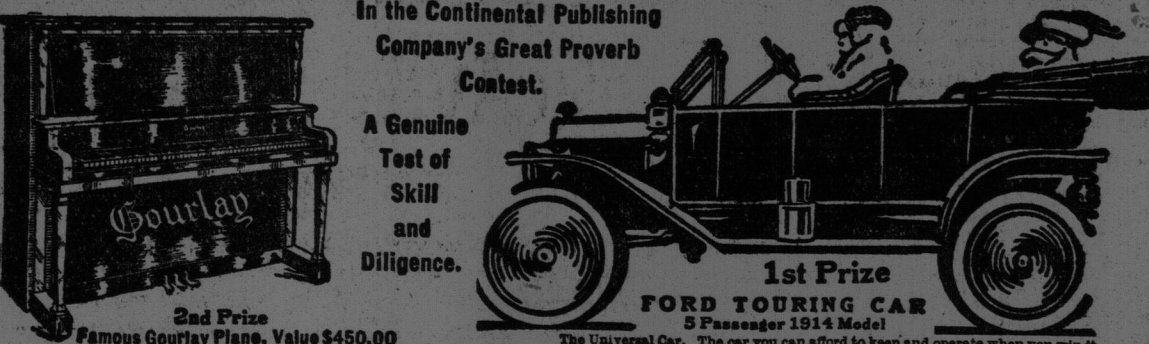
