### JELICOE'S REPORT ON NAVAL PLAN FOR ANTIPODES

Admiral Jelicoe's report has been tabled in the House of Representatives. The admiral finds that the ideal of a single navy is not attainable and the general principle proposed is that New Zealand should co-operate in the naval defence of the empire and assist by paying for, maintaining and manning a certain proportion of the far eastern fleet. For the support of this fleet, Great Britain should contribute seventy-five per cent, Australia twenty per cent and New Zealand five per cent.

### NO ANNOUNCEMENT YET.

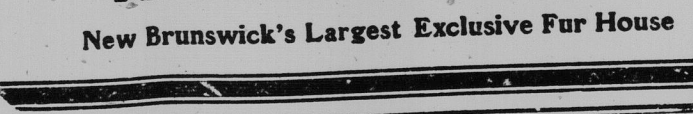
