THE FEELHY BROTHERS ARRESTED IN MICHIGAN—What Their Story Amounts to—Very Little Excitement Created in Biddulph.

LONDON, May 22.—Within the past day or two public interest has been awakened throughout the country generally, and in this district in particular, by reports of the arrest of the two brothers Feehley in Michigan, and steps are now being taken for their extradition.

It will be remembered that a family named Feehley, composed of the father, mother, and number of grown-up sons and daughters, lived in the neighbourhood of the Donnelly's, and were on friendly terms with the family, so much so that the Feehley boys were supposed to be implicated with the Donnelly's in many of the crimes committed in Biddulph.
