Ottawa Dec. 30th. 1915.

Sir,-

George Storr has written to the Department to the effect that he is in legal possession of Lot 15 in the Fairford Indian Reserve, being the legal heir of his father, now dead; also that he is not a Treaty Indian.

The records here do not show that George Storr has been paid as a Treaty Indian. The limits of the Fairford Indian Reserve are now being confirmed by Order in Council. Please ascertain as soon as you conveniently can whether George Storr's claim to the said Lot 15 is valid and that his statement that he is not a Treaty Indian is correct, in order that it may be decided whether the Lot is to be included as part of the Reserve or to be excluded therefrom.
