The "Men of the Northern Zone" who Beat the Record of the Arctic—Willis Chipman, of Toronto, Originator of a New Plan of Attack.  
Much interest was excited by an article in a recent issue of the Popular Science Monthly upon "Arctic Exploration," in which the writer, Stuart Jenkins, gave reasons for his belief that the most advanced country around and between Rivers Yukon and Mackenzie; men like Geologist Low, who spent last winter in Labrador, and was the first white man to pierce the ice barrier of the north; and others, who were educated, plucky, strong and intrepid to follow the line of collimation of the mountains and make their way to the North Pole.
