Parliaments may not be altogether unmixed blessings, particularly in Latin countries; but their abolition, or even their temporary removal, is always dangerous.

It is laid down by law that the Cortes must sit for three months each year; the general elections must take place every four years; and that in case of a dissolution a new parliament must be called together immediately. The Cortes, unlike the British parliament, meets and separates without the intervention of the sovereign.
