SESSION A FAIRERE FOR THE O

Afforded Little Opportunity to Obtain Political Capital.

MUCH LEGISLATION

Many Important Government Measures Introduced and Numerous Private Bills—Territorial Revenues of Province Largely Increased.

Fredericton, April 20.—The legislature of New Brunswick met this morning at eleven o'clock and concluded the business of the session at 1.30. At three o'clock His Honor the Governor came down to the Parliament Building accompanied by his usual staff, and proceeded to the House.
The legislature convened on the 7th day of March and has therefore been in session six weeks and three days, the longest session since 1907. During the session 130 bills were presented, 118 of which were enacted into law, twelve having either withdrawn or failed to pass the committee of the whole.

In many respects the session has been the most important since Confederation. The government programme was a lengthy one and included measures of the highest importance to the future development of the province. The long discussed Valley Railway, as a result of the legislation of the present year is to become an actuality and the hopes of the people of the St. John Valley so long deferred, are to be fulfilled by the construction of a first-class railway from St. John to Grand Falls.
The full development of the coal areas of Sunbury and Queens has been made possible through the construction of the Gibson and Minto railway. As a result of former legislation these coal areas have been partially developed and between forty and fifty thousand tons of coal have been mined annually for the past two or three years. A new arrangement made and enacted into law by the present government provides for construction of a railway from Gibson to Minto. The government guarantees the interest on the bonds to the extent of \$15,000 a mile and return receives 40 per cent. of the gross income. One of the provisions of the bill is that the railway company is to take for their own use 50,000 tons of arroyo coal annually, and in transporting the same over the newly constructed railway. The arrangement therefore guarantees a sufficient traffic to pay the interest on the bonds guaranteed by the government. Under another section the Canadian Pacific will agree to lease the railway to the New Brunswick Coal and Railway proposition upon which the government is now suffering an annual loss of about \$20,000, and to pay therefor one-half of the net earnings as rental. Altogether the arrangement is a most favorable one for the province as it prevents further loss in the operation of the New Brunswick Coal and Railway property, the ownership of which passes to the province through the failure of the company organized to carry out an arrangement made with the federal government the history of which is well understood.
