MURDERED AND JEWELS STOLEN

Burglars missed strong box containing jewelry worth from \$250,000 to \$500,000 - Servant confesses he admitted burg-

New York, Sept. 9.—Owney Talas, a Russian Finn, for two and one-half months a hall boy in the home of Mrs. Elizabeth Nichols, the aged widow who met death last night at the hands of masked men who robbed her of gems valued at \$10,000, was arrested today after he had confessed, the police assert, to having played a part in the crime.

He was formally charged with murder. All other servants in the house were freed of suspicion, Deputy Po-lica Commissioner Lord announced. Preliminary examination of Mrs Nichols' body revealed the probability that she had died of fright, and not of strangulation as at first supposed, Mr. Lord said. An autopsy to be performed later will disclose the exact cause of death.

Although the burglars stripped their victim's fingers and ears of diamonds and other jewels worth \$10,000, they failed to rifie the strong-box of her wafe in which she kept gems valued at from \$250,000 to \$500,000.

The murdered woman was the widow of James E. Nichols, one of the founders of the wholesale grocery house of Austin, Nichols & Company. She was 60 years old. When her husband died a year ago he left her property valued at nearly \$2,000,000.
