Hazel Flewelling assisted at the throughout the musical features close of the evening refre were served, after which expressed his desire to th M. C. A. and especially P.





Boston, Oct 22—The first full cargo of refined sugar ever shipped from this port to Europe will go out next week in the holds of the British Str Polruan and will be delivered either at a French or a British port. It will prob-ably go to London, although the des-tination of the vessel has not yet been announced. The Polruan left Cardiff, Wales, Oct 9, and is expected to reach Wales, Oct 9, and is expe 4,500 tons of sugar. The cargo is un-derstood to be for the British govern-ment.
