PARIS BOMBARDED AGAIN YESTERDAY.

Four Killed and Nine Injured Monday in Another Air Raid—Big Gun Can Carry 90 Miles—Pope Protests.

Paris, April 2.—The eighth long range bombardment of Paris began at 10.10 o'clock today, when a projectile exploded in the region of the city. Four persons were killed and nine wounded yesterday by shells fired by the long range German cannon.

Pope Protests.
 London, April 1.—(Via Reuter's Ottawa Agent).—A despatch from Rome says that the Pope has lodged a protest with Berlin against the bombardment of Paris, and especially the destruction of churches and wholesale massacre of people.

Air Raid.
 Paris, April 2.—An air raid warning was sounded at 3.15 o'clock this morning. Anti-aircraft guns began to fire immediately and a continuous curtain of fire was placed around the capital. At 4.25 it was announced that all danger was over. The night was calm and the moon glided fully through the light and fleecy clouds, amidst which glided the twinkling lights of the French air planes defending Paris.

90 Mile Gun.
 Lisbon, Portugal, April 2.—Benito Castro, a Portuguese engineer, is said by the Seulo to have invented a gun which will throw a shell 90 miles.

PRIEST INTERVENES IN BEHALF OF BROTHER

Monsignor Bolo Files Application for Revision of Case Against Bolo Pasha.

Paris, April 2.—Monsignor Bolo today filed at the Ministry of Justice an application for revision of the case of his brother, Bolo Pasha, sentenced to death on the charge of treason. The application is based chiefly on the allegation that there was no proof that the cablegrams sent by Count Von Bernstorff when he was German ambassador at Washington, to the German foreign office, which were produced at the trial, referred to his brother, and that there was not sufficient evidence as to the authenticity of the cablegrams, which were supplied to the French government by the American authorities.

The application will be referred to a special commission formed at the Ministry of Justice. Only in the event that the commission finds there are sufficient grounds will the application go before the court.
