London, June 12-(Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency)-The newspapers state that it is foolish to attempt to mini mize the significance of the enemy's gains of ground, where every kilometre is most valuable, but they point out that the Germans are very far from achieving their programme, while their sacrifices are greater than in any previous battle of the war. For the first time, indeed, since March, they have been effectively counter-attacked with a swiftness which gives their storm troops no chance to rest.

German efforts to batter down the French defences between Montdidier and the Oise, begun on Sunday, seem to have been checked on the third day of the struggle.

On the western end of the battle line the French have counter-attacked and have regained important ground, while on the centre and right repeated efforts by the ensmy to exploit his earlier success have been met with stern resistance from the French who claim that the Germans are being held.
