But it was no scene of deso-lation for the men, buoyed up by the number of skins and the amount of oil which lay to their credit in the holds of the Eagle, and the quantities yet to come, broke the silence of the wild northland with rude but cheery choruses of the sea. During each day of the hunt, the crew re-turned at stated intervals to receive their rations of bread, butter, beef and coffee. Then with wild hurrahs they renewed their charge upon the bewildered seals. Nearly a mile square of the icy expanse was stained with the blood of the seal. WATERED RIBBONS On the evening of the 1/th of March the Eagle sailed into St. John's harbor, her halliards and rigging streaming with the flags of many nations and of every firm in the land, having made the quick-est sealing voyage on record and cap-tured the largest number of seals ever taken in one trip. Captain Jackman, of the Eagle, in 1867, received the gold medal of the Royal Hu-mane Society for saving more than forty lives on the coast of Labrador. The last of those whom he bore from the wreck died in his arms near the land. On reach-ing the shore he removed his own flannel shirt and wrapped it around the corpse, with the hope of reviving it. His only assistance in this noble and humane ex-ploit was a man who helped to fasten the line to the pier head from which he swam to the wreck more than forty times.
