Chadsey, and Mrs. Etheridge.

The provincial secretary being absent Miss B. S. McDougall was appointed to that office, pro-tem.

Mrs. Sargison, was appointed to report proceedings of convention to the Victoria press, and Mrs. Tate, to the local papers.

In the absence of the auditor appointed by the executive, Mrs. J. Hall, of Vancouver, was appointed by the convention to fill that position.

Considerable discussion took place as to the rights of honorary members and the election of delegates.

The synopsis of minutes of provincial executive was then read and adopted.

The subject of the world's petition for prohibiting intoxicants and opium was introduced by Mrs. Cunningham and discussed at considerable length by the convention.
