Results: Reports received by the Department indicate that the program was successful. Between July 25, 1968 and August 29, 1968, Canada Manpower Centres registered 11,652 students and made 12,231 placements. In addition there were many thousands of casual placements in day labour for farm work, berry picking, etc. There is no doubt that increased publicity lead to a greater number of jobs being obtained through CMCs than was normal for the time of the year.
