If the agents can arrange the sale of houses built by the commission it will help that body in the disposal of its property and will also be to the advantage of the man buying the house.

Mr. Dennis stated that a similar plan has been operated in St. Catharines for some time. A firm there arranged loans from the housing commission, had plans drawn, and superintended the actual building in return for fees paid to them.

Offers from two real estate firms to sell houses erected by the housing commission will come before that body at its meeting on Thursday night. It is possible that the commission may accept one of these in place of its present plan of selling through a business agent, F. B. Lavender.

The housing act will not permit the sale of houses except on a cost basis, and the commission will therefore not be able to pay the company making the sale. According to Commissioner E. R. Dennis, other arrangements can be made which will not violate the conditions of the housing act. The real estate men can act as agents for the person wishing to buy the house. They will make all arrangements for the loan and relieve the purchaser of other responsibilities. This will be a transaction between the prospective purchaser and the agent, and will have nothing to do with the housing commission. The commission will sell the houses at cost, and any fee paid to the agent will be from the purchaser. Citzens who wish to deal directly with the commission will still be permitted to do so. A large staff is kept constantly busy in dealing with this work.
