## THE U. S. FOOTBALL SEASON CLOSES

Day Is To-morrow. Rivals Are Military and Naval Academies.

READY FOR SERVICE GAME. New York, Nov. 28.—The football season of 1919 will close to-morrow afternoon when the rival teams from the United States Military and Naval Academies meet in their gridiron battle at the Polo Grounds in this city.

The contest will be the first between the two service teams since 1916, the contests of last year and the year before having been abandoned because of the war.

From a social standpoint the game between the Army and Navy elevates all others, as it attracts a most representative gathering of society leaders, army and navy officers, diplomats, and others prominent in all walks of life. Seated in the various boxes around the field of play to-morrow will be several members of President Wilson's cabinet, high officers of the army and navy, members of the foreign diplomatic corps at Washington, senators, congressmen, and many other national, state and city officials. The battalion of cadets of each academy will attend the game.

The Army-Navy game is the most spectacular as well as the most popular on the football schedule of the year. The uniforms of officers, the parading across the field of the battalions of gray-clad cadets and the regiment of blue-uniformed midshipmen, the martial music of the big brass bands, and the commingling of the colors of the American flag with the blue and gold of the navy and the gold and gray of the army, gave a picturesque setting that is inspiring.

Hotel managers declare the reservations this year outnumber those on any similar occasion in the past. Hundreds of rooms in the big hotels were secured by mail or telephone weeks ago, and persons making last hour calls are all receiving the same reply, "Sorry, but there is not a place left."

The rival teams appear to be rather evenly matched, although it is possible the West Pointers will rule slight favorites before the whistle sounds for the opening of hostilities. Both teams have made good records during the season, with the Army record showing the better performances.

To-morrow's game will be the twenty-second season of teams representing the West Point and Annapolis academies. The Army has won eleven and the Navy nine, with one game a tie. The record of the games to date is as follows:

Plans were discussed for the formation of a much improved cable service to be compiled in London by the Canadian Press, whereby the news from the British Empire would be especially minutely covered. 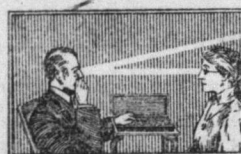
