Philadelphia's tribute of love and homage to the greatest outstanding figure of modern civilization, His Eminence Desideratus Cardinal Mercier, Primate of Belgium and Archbishop of Malines, reached a fitting climax in the stately Cathedral of St. Peter and Paul, Sunday, Sept. 28.

Cheering multitudes for miles had heralded the triumphal entry of the courageous Prince of the Church of God into the City of Brotherly Love on Friday at noon.

With wild acclaim, such as has seldom been vouchsafed any distinguished personage as guest of this municipality, the heroic prelate was greeted that evening in the tremendous mass meeting and reception at the Metropolitan Opera House, and later in the Academy of Music by the American Legion, valiant defenders of the nation.

Thronged lined the principal streets of the city and thoroughfares leading to the Main Line suburban towns to catch a glimpse of His Eminence. Cheers told of his approach and salves rent the air as he departed, more marked after the luncheon that stilled every multitude as the brave and pious prelate raised his hand in benediction.

Friday and Saturday all loyal citizens, regardless of creed or race, vied in paying homage to Philadelphia's distinguished guest. On Sunday, however, it seemed that the faithful claimed him for their very own.

ANNUAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS

OF THE DIOCESE OF LONDON, AT TILBURY, ONTARIO

Many people from the Border Cities, the parishes of Woodlee, Belle River, Stony Point, St. Peter's, Chatham, St. Joachim, Maidstone, Tecumseh, Leamington and Staples were in Tilbury on Wednesday, October 1st, to attend the eighth annual Eucharistic Congress of the Diocese of London.

After the singing of the Gospel Rev. Father D. Pinsonneault, McGregor, Ont., preached in French on the Real Presence, explaining the promises of Christ and the teachings of the Church on this matter. Rev. Father Coughlin, C. S. B., of Sandwich College, followed with a sermon in English on the Holy Sacrifice, a manifestation of Jesus' Love, for He loved His own and loved them unto the end.

The choir was reinforced by an excellent string orchestra made up of young local musicians and several from the Ursuline College, Chatham. Immediately following the Pontifical Mass the procession of the Blessed Sacrament took place, passing out of the beautifully decorated church, perhaps the most beautiful in the Diocese of London, into the streets of the town.

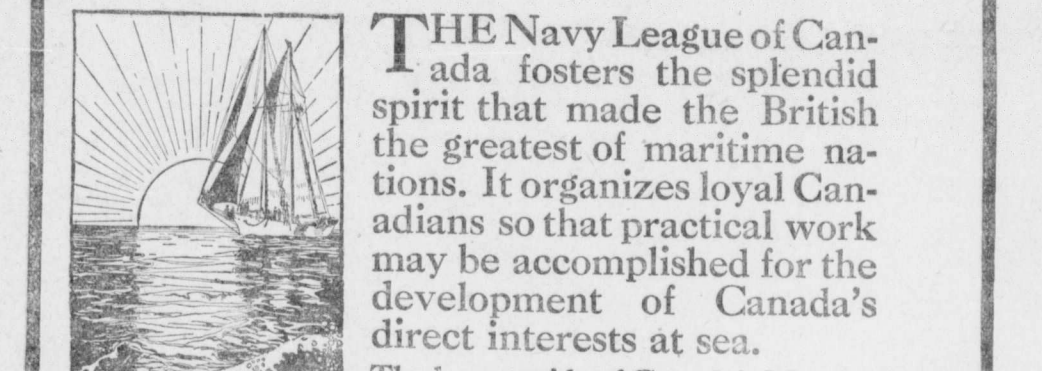
