IX. And be it enacted, That the said Ladies' Committee of Duties of Management shall and may send out to service, and apprentice management thereto, or to any healthy trade or business, all youths, male or youths may female, having the protection or aid of the said Institution, to such 5 person or persons, and upon such terms, as to the said Ladies' Committee of Management may seem fit and proper; and for that purpose shall have power, on behalf of and for such youths and themselves, to enter into and make with any person or persons with whom such youths may be placed by the said Ladies' Com-10 mittee of Management, articles of apprénticeship and agreement: and that such articles of agreement may be enforced as well by action at law or in equity for breach thereof, warranting any such acion, as by summary application to a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace (who is hereby authorized and empowered to act thereon,) 15 on any such occasion as would, according to the laws of this Province, warrant the interference or adjudication of any one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace in disputes between masters and apprentices: Provided always, that a copy of the articles Proviso, as to or indenture apprenticing such youth shall, within three days indentures. 20 from the time when such articles or indenture were executed, be lodged with the Clerk of the Common Council of the City of

X. And be it enacted, That the persons now acting as the Members of Committee or Board of Management of the said Institution, shall bo Managers of the Corporaporation, until such time as Managers shall be appointed under the provisions of this Act.

XI. And be enacted, That the Ladies' Committee of Manage-Benevolent ment shall have power to establish, in connection with the said House of In-30 Institution, a Benevolent Society and House of Industry, for the dustry, purpose of visiting and relieving the sick and destitute poor, and may frame By-Laws and Rules for the management and government of the said Society.

XII. And be enacted, That the said Trustees, on a requisition General mee-35 signed by not less than five subscribers to the Institution, may, at tings. any time, by a notice to be inserted not less than days previously, in one or more of the newspapers published in the City of Hamilton, call a general meeting of the subscribers to the Institution, specifying the hour, day, place, and object of the said 40 meeting; and the said subscribers, or the majority of them present at any such meeting, shall have full power to alter, suspend or revoke any By-laws, Orders, or Regulations, for the management of the said Institution, after notice of any motion for any such alteration, suspension or revocation shall have been given at the 45 general meeting next preceding that at which such motion shall be made and considered.
