EUS falls from lack of support

The Education Undergraduate Society has "suspended all operations due to lack of student sup-port," said acting president John Miller Monday.

All the EUS assets are frozen—

the offices are closed and the fees (\$3 from each member) will not be returned until further action is decided.

Out of 4,500 eligible students, only 400 joined the association. The executive council, who voted unanimously to dissolve the society, hope to have a reorganization committee look into forming another education students' society.

However, it won't reopen until two-thirds of the students ask for such action.

A referendum may be held within the next two months and fees will be returned at this time if a new society is voted down.

The EUS served a four-fold service to the Education students who joined it by giving them (in return for their \$3 fee):
(1) affiliated membership with

the Alberta Teachers' Association (2) discount rates on duplicating services

(3) discount rates on social functions

(4) subscription to the ATA magazine and Augury magazine (a production of the students and faculty which has also been suspended).

The EUS was the representative body of the education students and it presented briefs to the students' union, the Education Faculty Council and the ATA.

In a recent motion, the EUS increased the number of representatives on the Education Faculty Council to seven from two out of 90
