Memorandum for Mr. King

Mrs. D'Arcy McGee, telephoned me last night to say that she is interested in the destruction of other birds by Starlings in the district, and had discussed possible measures of prevention with Dr. Archibald of the Experimental Farm, who was in agreement with her that something should be done, and offered the suggestion that some official might be appointed at the farm for the purpose of keeping the Starlings in check.

Mrs. McGee wished to discuss the matter with you. I agreed with her that you were interested in matters of the kind, but at the same time told her I thought that she should approach the Minister of Agriculture, who could discuss the matter with his officials, including Dr. Archibald, and, if necessary, arrange to take proper steps to deal with the situation. Mrs. McGee agreed to see Mr. Gardiner, but wished me to let you know that she had brought the matter up.
