done in order to seewe the loca. tion for the School, did not have a little land ploughed and the location staked off, as this would have been of practical use in Connection with the distitution, whereas the hay will never probably be required at that sheli.

Sam also to state that the price paid for the cutting of this has seems very exorbitant and the hay was not cut on land belonging to mesers French routh. The Voucher cannot be paid until further information rela. tice to this matter is received. I likewise beg to refer you to the letter to you of the 31 20 betober last in which you
