
Sir,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant, enclosing credit voucher No. 610/16 received from Mr. Christianson accounting for advances made to him; and in reply I beg to say that after giving Mr. Christianson credit for this voucher, namely \$875.14, he has yet to account for the sum of \$187.91. The following amounts were received by Mr. Christianson, viz:-

As against these amounts Mr. Christianson has forwarded, attached to voucher No. 609/15, pay-lists and receipts aggregating \$2270.50 and with voucher No. 610/16, receipts aggregating \$875.14, making a total of \$3145.64, and leaving \$187.91 yet to be accounted for. The latter voucher might have been withheld until the total advance had been expended.
