
Sir,-

As you are aware, plans, etc., were prepared in 1916 for the rebuilding of the Alderville teacher's residence. The work was not proceeded with, however, owing principally to the scarcity of labour at that time. It is thought now that conditions there may be such that the work can be carried on economically. I have therefore to request that you will inform me if there is any capable and experienced man, whose services will be available as foreman as well as the other labour necessary with rate of pay for the doing of this work. Information should be forwarded as soon as possible that this may be given early consideration. The approval of the band should also be obtained, they having requested by resolution that no work should be done until after the war.
