"It is quite clear that under no circumstances, as the law now stands, could we dispatch from this country any substantial number of men if we desired to do so, because, as I have said, the statute now calls for parliament to meet in fifteen days after the country is at war, and I certainly agree that it would be impossible to send from this country any substantial number of troops under the appropriations as we now have them, without a governor general's warrant; and I cannot conceive of a government asking for a warrant and calling parliament together, as it must, within fifteen days from the date of hostilities or declaration of war."
