War claims; interim compensation

43. The Secretary of State for External Affairs said he was disturbed by the plight of certain Canadians who had suffered losses during the war and, while awaiting compensation, were in very straitened circumstances. He understood that Chief Justice Ilsley would not be in a position to submit his recommendations regarding war claims for some months. In the circumstances, on October 4th, he had written to the Secretary of State suggesting that steps be taken to relieve those persons who were in the most serious distress and asking Mr. Bradley whether he would request Chief Justice Ilsley to advise on the desirability and practicability of an immediate payment of partial interim compensation to claimants with assured claims where urgent compassionate areasons existed. It was understood that Chief Justice Ilsley was prepared to make recommendations in the matter.

44. The Cabinet, after further discussion, noted the report of the Secretary of State for External Affairs that he had requested the Secretary of State to take up with Chief Justice Isley the possibility of immediate payment of partial interim compensation to claimants in straitened circumstances who had assured war claims, and that Mr. Bradley planned to endeavour to obtain early recommendations from Chief Justice Ilsley in the matter.

United Nations; Canadian delegation to General Assembly

45. The Secretary of State for External Affairs submitted recommendations with respect to the composition of the Canadian delegation to the forthcoming General Assembly of the United Nations, meeting in Paris on November 6th.
