It makes itself the centre of all the work done for the good of the community. Every other benevolent, moral and religious enterprise looks to the Church as the source of its strength. The spirit which the church generates will manifest itself in meeting the higher needs of men in whatever form they may appear.

The Extent of the Work.

The extent of this work is enormous. This year we are supporting 768 Home Mission fields and 246 augmented charges. Co-operation with the Methodists and Congregationalists guarantees that the above represents not more than half of the actual mission work done by the bodies which soon will form the United Church of Canada.

Masses in the Cities.

This is only part of our problem. There are masses in the cities to whom the ordinary methods of church work do not appeal. We are seeking to reach these by our social settlements, and in Montreal, Toronto and Winnipeg we have flourishing institutions of this class, and expect to have them established in every congested centre in
