

## DETAILED ACCOUNTS.

---

In Passage leading to Office—one Door.

Pantry—Dresser, Shelving, and 2 squares of glass in the Door.

Back Stairs—no scroll or twist to the handrail, but winding steps, which were not intended by the plan.

Servants' Hall—a Glass Door.

Passage to Kitchen—a Glass Door.

Porch to Kitchen—all extra, with a small Dresser, Shelves, and 2 squares of glass in the other Door.

Kitchen—Window enlarged, Door removed, Dresser, Shelves, and 2 squares of glass in the Door.

Scullery (as marked in the plan)—fitted up for a Dairy, with Shelves, &c.

Larder (as marked on the plan)—fitted up for a Scullery and Larder, one Partition, one Door, Shelves, &c.

Wood-house (as marked on the plan)—fitted up for a Store-room, with Counter, Shelves, &c.

Wash-house (as marked on the plan)—fitted up for a Pantry, with Partition and Door, Closet with folding Doors, Dresser, Shelves, &c.

Saloon and Gallery—Plaster Cornices and Centre Piece, 4 extra columns in place of Pilasters.

Room above the Office—one Door, and one real Window in place of a sham window.

Room above Servants' Hall—one Door.

Bed room above the Kitchen—2 Closets, with folding doors, six pannels each, and shelves, one glass Door in the passage to East wing.

Passage to the West wing—Partition, Door and Window, Glass Door and six Steps.

Dressing Room, West wing—one Closet, folding Doors, small Closet, single Door and Shelving.

Bed room above Dining room—one Door.

Governor's Dressing Room—Closet, with one Door, and Shelves.

Bed room above Drawing room—Closet, one Door, and Shelves.

N. B.—I think it would be desirable that a close Stove, say of Sheet Iron, with a pipe running into the fire place, should be put in the three best rooms, to prevent the frost from injuring the plaster work.
