Dear Sir.—The members of the F.P.U. at Bryant's Cove have much pleasure in forwarding to you the sum of \$30.00 towards the Marine Disaster Fund, for the relief of those who have been bereaved of their earthly providers by the awful catastrophes which have befallen our country, resulting in desolated homes, and bleeding hearts for those who have so awfully, but nobly perished while engaged in their country's service.

We only wish that the sum were a greater one, but we have done our best; and with it we offer our heartfelt sympathy for those who have been so unexpectedly plunged in mourning.

**Touches Them Closely**

The part of the disaster which touches us most closely, is the loss of the ill-fated "Southern Cross," which took eight men from this little place—Lemuel James, William James, Isaac James, William Henry James, Elias James, Ernest Noseworthy, Norman Noel, Ernest Noseworthy and Thomas Briffett—the last five were members of the F.P.U. If they are gone, they met watery graves. Their sufferings, though different from those of the victims of the S.S. "Newfoundland," must have been intense. What cries arose amid the strife of the elements is known only to Him who rules the raging of the sea. We say this, because the passing of time without the appearance of the "Southern Cross" is forcing us to the conviction that she has gone down.

**Dead Gone—Help the Living**

We cannot bring back the lost, but we are doing the next best thing, that is our utmost to relieve those who were near and dear to them. May God bless and sustain them all in the darkest hour of our country's history, is our fervent and heartfelt prayer.
