STRUGGLE MUST BE LONG ONE

Guarding Important Points

One of the important duties of the department at present is arranging for guarding all public works and all the channels of communication against attempts by Germans or Austrians now in Canada to blow up bridges, public buildings, canal locks, etc. It is realized that there is a very serious need of this, and hundreds of plainclothesmen sworn in on instructions from the department here are now stationed all over the Dominion. Every big railway bridge is guarded, and extra precautions are being taken in outlying districts, such as those along the National Transcontinental Railway and in the northwest. All German and Austrian consuls who are not Canadian citizens have been given forty-eight hours in which to leave the country.

Units Ordered Out

Special precautions are being taken to strengthen the forces at Halifax, Sydney and Esquimaux and additional troops are being sent there. For service of this kind the department is not waiting to raise troops by the volunteer system, but is ordering out whole militia units under the provisions of the militia act. In the case of St. John, which is exposed to attack from any cruiser of the enemy, it is pointed out that since St. John is not fortified and is an open port under the international agreement governing war conditions, there could be no bombardment to destroy property unless resistance were offered. If an enemy's cruiser appeared at St. John, at Vancouver, or at any other unfortified port of the Dominion, the troops stationed there would retire and not invite the penalty of having the port shelled.

Kaiser Reserves Must Stay Here

Germans Will Not be Allowed to Return to Their Colors.

OTTAWA, Aug. 8.—German reservists remain in Canada. As previously intimated they will not be allowed to return to their colors. If they attempt to do so they will be arrested and detained, arrangements for this purpose having been made at all ocean ports. The necessary order-in-council was passed last night.

Germans residents who wish to remain in Canada to continue their ordinary business will not be molested unless they engage in hostile acts or otherwise contravene the laws of proclamation.

Those who go about their business quietly, without engaging in unlawful acts are entitled to the laws, protection, and the government expresses the earnest hope that they be not molested or interfered with.

A concrete case arose yesterday at Berlin, where a German reservist was put under arrest. W. G. Weichel, Minister of Militia, stating that the man did not wish to go back to his country, but was anxious to become a Canadian citizen, so orders for his release were given.

NOT HEARD OF

It is Not Known Where Lipton's Racing Yacht is to be Taken.

(By Special Wire to the Courier)

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—The yacht Shamrock IV, Sir Thomas Lipton's challenger for the America's Cup and her convoy the steam yacht Erin have not been heard from since they left Fayal on July 20 and members of the New York Yacht club expressed the opinion that Col. DuncanNeill who is in charge of the expedition was headed for either Halifax, Bermuda or New York.

If New York is the port of destination both yachts should reach Sandy Hook some time to-day or to-morrow.

CRUISER RETURNS

PEKING, China, Aug. 7.—The German cruiser Emden which was reported to have sunk yesterday is said to have returned to the Sing-Tau with one of the big vessels of the volunteer fleet sailing between Nagasaki and Vladivostok. She carried nearly 1,000 passengers and crew.

WINNIPEG GRAIN MARKET

WINNIPEG, Aug. 7.—Wheat prices were again soaring after a weak opening. American houses were selling while exporters and local traders were heavy buyers and at noon prices were on the rise. 2-1-4 for October, 2-3-4 for December and 2-4 for May, all higher than at opening.

Oats—Trade sharp advance. October being sold at 2-1-2 higher; Flax opened unchanged and at midday stood at 3 to 4-8 higher.

The demand for all grades of wheat was good, and cash oats were selling at 3-1-2c higher than yesterday's close. The buyers were principally houses with eastern connections. The British government bought all the cash oats available. The weather, while greatly improved as regards temperature, keeps dry only two points in the whole map recording moisture, these being Calgary and Edmonton, and it was light.

MONTREAL, Aug. 7.—The excitement which prevailed in the local grain market yesterday was more pronounced than ever today, and prices were booming under a continued brisk demand for supplies from all over the country, and a very active business was done.
