LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a fautly, or any male sl over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Suskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must appear to person at the Dominion Lauda Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lauda Agency (but not Sub Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Eix mosths' residence is each of three years after carning homestead patent; siso 50 acres extra cultivation. Preemption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and crect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to re-duction in case of rough, scrubby or stony fand. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
